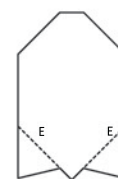
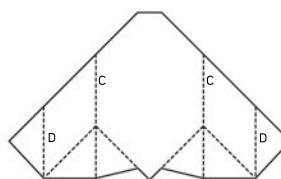
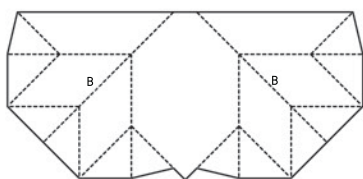
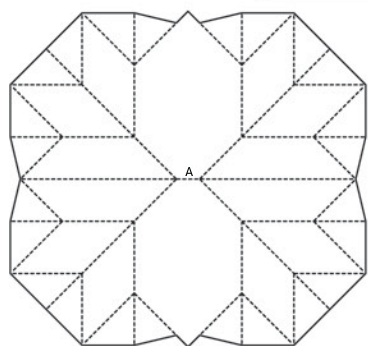


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MISFOLD pattern

- 1 print out the piece and cut all along the solid outline.
- 2 fold the piece in half along fold line A
- 3 fold each side diagonally in half along fold lines B
- 4 fold both forward and backward to weaken the crease - then pop it inward inside the card
- 5 fold creases C and D both forward and backward

- 6 pop each side inward (along creases C) and pop each side back outward along creases D
- 7 fold creases E forward and backward and pop each inward inside card
- 8 repeat process on second sheet of paper and carefully glue pieces back to back

tips for joinery:
 gluing 4 in the same orientation (lining up pointy ends) = circular form
 gluing 2 in the same direction and reversing the next two = long form in video
